This is an important breakthrough, and we call on government to assist employers to develop programs to provide this benefit. **AWOTM is especially concerned to ensure refugee women get mental health and financial support if they are victims of domestic violence, irrespective of their visa status**.

Afghan Women on the Move started four years ago, is refugee lead, and a peak body representing and fostering community cohesion, women's empowerment and multicultural community representation in Australian and Afghanistan humanitarian programs. We are open to all faiths and are non-politically based. We maintain close relationships with local, federal and state governments, the diplomatic corps and industry groups of all types. We showcase opportunities to the Australian Afghan community of over 5000 people through an active program of events and information.

I look forward to working with the new government and anyone else at the decision-making table, to address long-term disadvantage for multicultural women. Together we can deliver a fairer Australia for all Australians.
